Dear Member,

Can you believe that March will be here in only a few days (as I am writing this). Time really does fly by.

Everyone is hard at work finalizing all of the details go into construction project. The architects are completing all

of the detailed plans and will have final drawings very soon. Initial permit requests have been made with the City and are being reviewed presently. Our interior design firm has had three (3) meetings with the Club's Design Committee and I know that they are all very excited about the project as the beginning choices are taking place. Our Long Range Planning Committee is meeting with our contractor and architects every week pouring over the minute details that go into every construction project. Everything is in excellent hands

Our timeline is very tight but with the progress that is being made very realistic. The Fitness Center and Pool Deck area including our new Bistro Grill is on schedule to open prior to next Thanksgiving with the Spa following within 4-6 weeks.

But what about the intermediate period you ask.... as of this moment we are on schedule to close our Pool Facility right after the Easter/ Passover Holiday period and the same will apply to our Fitness Center. That translates to a

closing sometime between April 19th to May 1st.

Your management team has arranged for reciprocity with both Woodfield and the Polo Club for use of their fitness centers. Details on this will be given to you as the date approaches.

In addition the Club's Media room will be converted into a temporary fitness facility with aerobic and weight equipment being installed there. The sliding doors of our Card room will be closed and the back room will be converted into a temporary facility for various types of aerobic classes each morning until 11AM. Laurel Pointe has graciously agreed to let the Club utilize its pool for water aerobics in the morning. Lastly we will be setting up a temporary facility for manicures, pedicures and facials.

We value all of our employees that work in these areas and your Club is working on a program to maintain their services so that they will be here to greet you when our beautiful new facilities open.

Yes, you will have some inconveniences; however an attempt has been made to limit these in every area possible and I know that once this final construction phase is completed we will all appreciate and be proud of our Club's facilities and enjoy all that it offers.

Till next month, remember that each and every day counts; appreciate them for what they have to offer and do not waste them on trivia.



MAINTENANCE

Joseph Hubbard, CGCS OLD COURSE

Now that the Allianz Tournament is over for the year, we proceed into the full gambit of key Members' Tournaments for this season. If the weather continues to hold, it will be one of the warmest winters in history. With the tepid atmosphere the course will continue to remain pristine green and detailed with early turf growth. The experiment of keeping the ropes off the course and traffic curtailed to the most susceptible areas (i.e approaches, green surrounds and entrances from the tees to the fairways) has worked to date. We will watch for future weather events that may prevent us from always doing that each year but for the most part we will cautiously favor the members ability to access the course unrestricted with exceptions to the aforementioned. It is your golf course! Protect it as much as you can by obeying the rules and the etiquette of the game.

For the past several years, as play increased and the Old Course gained notoriety and National exposure, we knew that the tee boxes were lacking in size and in some instances, quality turf. With input from Mr. Jim Casty (Green Chairman), John Skaf (Head Professional) and Phil Peterson, (Old Course Superintendent) we were able to summarize a master spreadsheet to expand multiple individual tees, combine several others and overall replace the tifsport Bermuda turf with the Sealsle 1 Paspalum sod we already have on several tees. The good news for the Old Course members is that the tee expansion and regrassing has been approved for this summer.

With more teeing space and quality turf to hit from, your golf course experience will be even better than it has been in the past. The logistics of where to start and anything planned for this summer will be an ongoing discussion between the Green and Golf Committees, ProShop, Mr. Crean and our Maintenance Department. We will keep you posted as to the order and time frame the project is to be instituted.





MAINTENANCE Joseph Hubbard, CGCS CLUB COURSE

As I am writing this letter, the Club Championship has started and will be fought for over the next week. The greens currently are in remarkable shape and putting very true and consistent.

The rest of the golf course has never looked better, especially at this time of the year.

I have submitted an aerification schedule for both golf courses to all the powers (proshops, food & beverage, golf committees, green committees, etc) so everyone can coordinate their dates for outings. I always take in to consideration holidays, South County League, Palm League, Emerald League, etc. when making out our maintenance schedule. The next Newsletter for May and June will have the dates for all the summer tournaments and aerifications closings.

A SIDE NOTE OFF THE FAIRWAY

It was inevitable that I was going to get the call about "that stuff hanging off those sickly looking Oak Trees on the golf course". Several homeowners and golfers have inquired when I was going to remove the Spanish Moss (Also called Grandfather's Graybeard or Florida Moss down here in the South) because it was killing the trees.

Actually the Spanish Moss is not being removed from the trees as the Oaks that have the most are the ones that survived several hurricanes, the extended periods of drought and the record cold of the three winters previously before this awesome winter. Spanish Moss is not a parasitic invader but an opportunistic epiphyte (plant that grows on top of another plant but does not depend on it for nutrition). It is an air plant that lives upon other plants (I believe more so, on the thinner trees but that is not always 100% true) such as the Oaks on our golf courses. Spanish Moss absorbs nutrients and water from the air and rainfall. It is not a biologic parasite such as mistletoe that extracts nutrients out of the tree. The moss creates its own food. It just happens to be in the trees and has become quite the commodity for flower stores and nurseries that package dried moss for displays. There are even reports of groups targeting golf courses and stealing the moss out of the trees to sell to other golf courses and those nurseries. If kept misted lightly with water the moss can be kept alive and transplanted in other trees to thrive.

As a sentimental person, I love the look because it reminds me of my youth living around the southern United States. I remember seeing the dramatic displays of Spanish Moss hanging down during lazy sunsets giving one the eerie charm we once knew growing up in simpler times. So during your time around the golf courses, take note of a special display by Mother Nature for our enjoyment and breathe in the moment.







Learnin' With Vernon Tips & Strategies For Fun & Successful Tennis!

WHEN CAN I LOB



You should lob the ball dependent on what you or your opponents do based on the following scenarios.

- 1) When your opponents are too close to the net it is a good time to lob. This does not mean your opponents are merely at the net (i.e. the service line). They must be several feet inside the service box.
- 2) You should lob if one or more of your opponents are poaching. This will slow down the number of times the person poaches and will keep the ball away from the aggressive net player. Lob cross court first. Lobbying over

the net person may be challenging if your lob is short. That means trouble for your team.

- 3) You should lob if your opponent has difficulty hitting an overhead or moving backwards.
- 4) You should lob when you are off balance or out of position when at the baseline. When possible, hit this lob to the baseline person with emphasis on height.
- 5) You can lob off the return of a serve. Although this is a risky shot, hitting a lob on the return, over the net person's head is a great strategy for opponents that serve & volley or the net player that poaches immediately after the opponent's partner serves the ball.

Lobbying is a great tool that will give you time and put your opponents in a precarious position.




