From The Finance Committee

I hope you are enjoying the summer. The members of the Finance Committee will begin their review of the budget for the 2006-2007 fiscal year on June 28th. The By Laws of the club require that the Finance Committee recommend to the Board of Governors for approval the annual operating budget. On July 25th the Board of Governors will begin its review of the Budget. The Budget will either be adopted as presented by the Finance Committee or can be amended by the Board of Governors. Once the budget is adopted the Board will determine the amount of dues needed by each member class to satisfy the budget.

From an operating point of view the financial results through May 31, 2006 shows an operating profit. There still exist many timing related issues regarding expenditures as a result of the hurricanes. We expect there to be timing issues throughout the remainder of the year as a result of delayed expenditures. Management is working towards reducing expenditures during the last four months of our fiscal year to remain profitable for the entire year. Operating revenues exceed operating expenses by \$467,000. Net hurricane expenses after a partial recovery of losses from our insurance company totaled \$1,394,000. Interest on reserve fund balances totaled \$44,000. After deducting hurricane expenses and adding in the interest on the reserve balances, total expenses exceed revenues by \$883,000. We expect to be submitting a claim to our insurance company to recover the balance of our damages within the next thirty days.

Working capital shows an operating deficit of \$1,008,000 which will improve once we begin to recover the balance of the expenditures incurred related to the hurricanes from the insurance company and receive the Water settlement money for the Old Course.

On a positive note the Club has available free cash reserves of approximately \$2,600,000 segregated in bank accounts.

Lightning Safety

Our lightning warning system is state of the art technology. Here are a few things you should know:

There are Two Warning Signals (Siren):

- Lightning Imminent : One (1) Long Blast...May be repeated. Immediately Take Cover
- Reduced Danger (all clear) Three (3) Short Blasts

Areas to seek out in the event of lightning:

Open Areas	Lightning Shelters
Clubhouse	Maintenance Buildings
On-Course Buildings	Automobiles or Trucks

If none of the above are available, seek out Dense Woods or Low Lying areas

Areas to Avoid

Open Areas	Water
Tall trees	Metal fences
Overhead Wires and Power Lines	Elevated ground
Golf Carts	Mowers
Avoid use of Cellular Phones	Avoid use of Radios

Paul Latshaw recent visit to both golf courses sharing his knowledge and experience. Jack Hardy, Old Course Superintendent, Paul Latshaw and Joseph Hubbard, CGCS, Director of Golf Course Maintenance



Paul R. Latshaw was contacted by Mr. John Crean and the Board of Governors to consult for Broken Sound Club in trying to help stimulate our tifsport bermuda grass on the fairways, tees and

high traffic areas. His visit took place at the beginning of June. A report was generated for the Board, Joseph Hubbard, CGCS and Mr. Crean that addressed what he observed and comments on the aggressive program we have instituted to turn the courses around as quickly as possible. Further reports are forthcoming as the soil tests reach him and, along with Joe Hubbard, tries to find a solution to any problems that may be present.

Mr. Latshaw's credentials include 40 years of experience as one of the premiere superintendents in the country and is now one of the most sought after turfgrass consultants in the industry. Latshaw is noted to have prepared more golf courses for major championships than anyone else. He currently finished consulting for Jack Nicklaus and Paul's own son, Paul B. Latshaw, at Muirfield Village and is now at this writing at Winged Foot putting the finishing touches on for the US Open. A few of Paul's stints as superintendent include Oakmont Country Club, Congressional Country Club, Winged Foot and Augusta National. He has hosted four Master's tournaments, two PGA Championships, one US Open and two US Senior Open Championships besides consulting on several other majors the past several years.

Turf Talk

Joseph Hubbard, CGCS

For those of you here in the summer, I know you can see a big difference taking place on our turf, with special emphasis on the fairways between where we were last year and now. The programs we have instituted have taken hold and we now have two well-defined courses we can have fun playing while enjoying the aesthetic value. With the new grass beds and multiple tree additions, the dynamics that were always envisioned for both golf courses are now more pronounced.

CLUB COURSE:

With the visit of Paul Latshaw, one of the premiere golf course consultants in the world, we have validated that we are on track with the aggressive program for the fairways and remainder of the golf course. His suggestions of being even more aggressive were taken seriously under consideration (please see newsletter side bar story on Latshaw's visit).

Projects Update:

Financially we will be able to do some key weak tees around the course before next season in seashore paspalum turf. The sod on a few tees we already did in paspalum did not survive the shipping from Georgia and had to be replaced. The tees topped in paspalum last year are exceptional.

We are continuing to add more beds for aesthetic purposes around tees and wide-open areas throughout the course. The biggest burden is finding the labor to maintain all the beds and landscaping added in the last two years. The plan is to utilize the clubhouse landscape maintenance crew to upkeep the beds along with whomever we can assign to the tasks.

Phase I of the Jaskela overall landscape plan, which was modified by us to help replenish tree loss from the hurricanes, is completed. Phase II will be implemented next spring and summer on the long-range multi-year plan.

Planning and funding the project for the driving range drainage and reconfiguring the practice area is ongoing. This project's goal is the expansion of all the tees, conversion to seashore paspalum grass, move and rebuild the chipping green compound, add a practice putting green across from the starter shed and possibly sod the target greens as well with paspalum.

OLD COURSE:

The big news is the preparation for the Old Course for the Champion's Tour event in February. The discussion will be taking place whether to oversee the rough with ryegrass and grow it to 5" height. The course from above and around will be defined most definitely with the rye, however, what will the impact be to our rough? Either way we will be able to make the course recovery as expeditious as possible.

Projects Update:

Other than a few new tree issues and a few small beds, we have completed our landscaping beds for the year.

Rebuilding the rear driving range facility and adding more square footage to the main driving range tee is still desirable. The expansion needs to be started immediately and completed in a timely fashion to be ready for the upcoming season.

The deep tine aerifier has completed its first overall aerification along with the pull behind and walking aerifiers. We will continue to punch the golf course to break the compacted layer and soften the golf course.

Landscape timber will be added along several coquina paths throughout.

Bunker consistency and sand additions will be a priority to keep the sand as pure as possible for the winter play.

We are still adding cart path extensions to keep the carts more confined in areas to allow the surrounding areas to flourish with a break from the repeated compaction.

Expansion of the practice putting green will need to be addressed for the increased play and the Tour event.

An additional rear tee on #17 that will add 35 to 50 yards of distance will be built.

I am certain they will succeed in all of their endeavors.

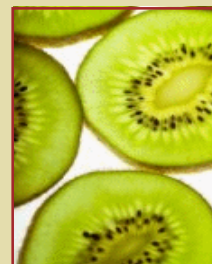

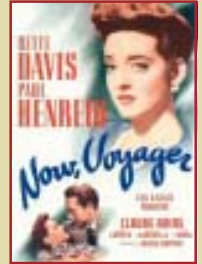

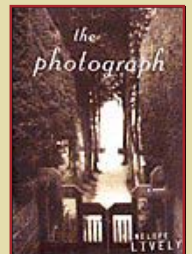
